

Manoir Duchamp

Overview

In a wonderful area in the middle of a bastide town Eymet, Manoir Duchamp is a perfect setting for an unforgettable holiday in the south of the vibrant Dordogne, in southwestern France.

Walk up via the impressive stone steps and proceed into the gorgeous entrance hall. On your right, there are French doors opening up to the impressive kitchen and dining room – a traditional country-style vibe is elevated with sleek appliances, and there are three ovens and seven burners ensuring you can comfortably prepare the most elaborate meals you've ever dreamed of.

When you need to relax horizontally after a great meal, find a snug area just above the kitchen that boasts a sofa and TV, or continue to the glorious drawing room. Special care has been taken to maintain the original and charming patina – note the high ceilings combined with antique furnishings, chandeliers and a pop of pattern that elevate these spaces while creating a welcoming ambience. There are seven bedrooms in total, some with modern en-suite bathrooms – and if you're fast enough, you might get the one featuring a sleek clawfoot bathtub.

To the back of the villa, you'll find a modern swimming pool large enough to accommodate fitness enthusiasts and those who prefer to relax by the edge with a cocktail in hand at the same time. Catch sun rays on the sun beds or the opposite; hide away from the blazing heat underneath the gazebo, offering a splendid view of the idyllic panorama. Additional furniture and seating areas around the beautiful garden ensure guests can find their private spot when needed.

You're just a short stroll away from Eymet's historic centre, lined with medieval streets, which become the home to a bustling market every Thursday morning. Among local amenities are restaurants, wine bars, cafés and pretty shops selling everything from souvenirs to handmade jewellery.

Bergerac is also a short drive away if you're into exploring its historic lanes, visiting the famous Maisons de Vins and dining in some excellent restaurants. Wine lovers can visit some of the local vineyards and châteaux, whilst further afield, you'll find the wine town of Saint-Émilion or charismatic wineries around Bordeaux.

The area is famed also for its historical sites and is within easy reach of all the famous 'Perigord' tourist attractions, including some of the region's most delightful villages along the Dordogne River, not to mention walking, horse-riding and cycling in the pastoral countryside.

Location & Local Information

An attractive location near the Dropt River in southwestern France's Dordogne department makes Manoir Duchamp a fantastic place to immerse in the local culture and explore this lesser-known part of the country.



You're right in the heart of an attractive medieval town Eymet, with a thriving central market square and idyllic location on the banks of the Dropt River. A simple stroll through its pretty streets lined with centuries-old houses will make you feel like you're living in a fairytale. Apart from its Thursday market, there are markets on Tuesdays during the summer months, plus other festivals and celebrations. Many paths running along the Dropt River offer stunning views, and guests are encouraged to explore the parks and scenery on foot or on bicycles. If you're feeling homesick, there's a shop selling British produce in the city centre, while a large supermarket can be found less than a 15-minute walk away.

In addition, there's an array of lovely medieval villages scattered all around the crumbling backcountry, such as Agnac, Miramont-de-Guyenne, Seyches and Lauzun, many of which have charming chateaux, cafés and sleepy streets for wandering around.

Bergerac is only a 30-minute drive away and lies on the Dordogne River, offering a wealth of wholesome opportunities such as boat tours, canoeing and walking. It also has an old town centre, a quay and plenty of boutique shops. Make sure also to visit Maisons de Vins – a historic site and monument that allows you to immerse yourself in the magical world of the renowned "vin liquoreux" (sweet white wine). Classified as a town of art and history, it hosts outdoor concerts in summer, while others might want to head to the fascinating National Tobacco Museum.

Another fantastic city nearby is Agen, with an oceanic climate which helps nature to thrive. You can visit one of its nature reserves and parks, such as the Réserve naturelle nationale de la frayère d'Alose, accessed via an old footbridge and boasting splendid riverside views. Alternatively, explore the city and walk to the Pont-Canal d'Agen bridge to soak up the sunshine before sampling the regional cuisine in one of the restaurants nearby.

The vibrant city and the capital of French wine, Bordeaux, can be reached in just 1.5 hours by car. Radiating 18th-century grandeur, it's bursting at its seams with art galleries, winding streets, vibrant city squares and historical landmarks worth lingering for. After your morning coffee and croissant in one of the terraced cafés that spill effortlessly onto the sidewalk, head to the Grand Théâtre and the nearby Place des Quinconces for a dose of old-world charm. The Place de la Bourse is one of the city's many historic city squares and features grand 18th-century architecture, a fountain and a vast reflecting pool that will become the source of your Instagram posts. After a culture-filled day, find a table in one of the cosy bars or enjoy a fine-dining experience – you'll be truly spoilt for choice here.
