Boasting four enchanting en-suite bedrooms, each meticulously designed and adorned, Little Hideaway exudes an air of sophistication and comfort. The ground floor bedrooms offer versatility, with the option to configure them as twin beds or lavish super-king doubles. The bedrooms pamper guests with indulgent touches such as sumptuous mattresses, plush cloud-like mattress toppers, exquisite 400-thread-count cotton bedding and sumptuously lavish drapes. Soft bathrobes, fine body-wash and invigorating shampoos await in the pristine, beautifully designed bathrooms, ensuring a pampering retreat. Just across the landing is the characterful, tranquil living room with its gorgeous ceiling beams, lavish sofas, beautiful modern artworks and feature fireplace. It's a great place to snuggle up and relax or disappear to with the Sunday newspapers and a mug of steaming tea. Little Hideaway comes with a giant retractable smart television, a bluetooth soundbar in the living room and a bluetooth DAB radio in the kitchen so that you can relax along to your favourite tunes.

The elegance of dining extends outdoors into the enchanting garden, where an alfresco dining table and charcoal barbecue set the stage on a south-facing terrace for memorable feasts under the twilight sky. An outdoor sofa is the perfect spot for pre-dinner drinks and planning your Somerset and Devon adventures while a fire-pit extends the evening's embrace. The pièce de résistance, a wood-fired hot tub, offers relaxation accompanied by sweeping views of the orchard and woodland.

Location & Local Information

Little Hideaway sits within 3000 acres of Dillington's parkland. Without leaving the estate, you can enjoy fabulous walks, beautiful scenery and much wildlife. The pretty tapestry of neighbouring towns and villages invites further exploration.

In close proximity, the regal Dillington House and the National Trust's Barrington House stand as testaments to history, their gardens unfolding for your delight. Montacute House is just a short drive away, a splendid Elizabethan mansion where you can immerse yourself in history as you stroll through its opulent rooms, marvel at its architecture and lose yourself in its meticulously landscaped gardens. Ham Hill Country Park is another nearby wonder where you can explore an expansive country park that offers panoramic views, meandering trails and beautiful spots for picnics and wildlife spotting. The Iron Age hill fort and the charming village of Stoke-sub-Hamdon are also nearby. Just a stone's throw away lies the Dennis Chinaworks in Shepton Beauchamp, a haven of tea rooms and artisanal craftsmanship that beckons the curious.

The wonderful Glastonbury is steeped in legend and spirituality. You can climb Glastonbury Tor for panoramic views, explore the ruins of Glastonbury Abbey and peruse quirky shops offering crystals, esoteric literature, and local crafts.

Cheddar Gorge and Caves offer dramatic landscapes where towering limestone cliffs and ancient caves create a mesmerising backdrop. Visitors enjoy exploring the enchanting underground chambers and learning about the area's geological and archaeological significance.

Wells is the smallest city in England. It boasts a magnificent cathedral with stunning architecture and intricate carvings. The Bishop's Palace and its serene gardens provide an oasis of tranquility.

Wookey Hole Caves offers a subterranean world of



underground chambers, prehistoric remains and an assortment of attractions, including a museum, a mirror maze, and a life-sized model of a woolly mammoth.

Another delightful afternoon trip is to the lovely Forde Abbey and Gardens. Forde Abbey is a former Cistercian monastery turned stately home. You will love exploring the splendid, colourful gardens, including a stunning walled garden, a tranquil lake and a seriously high water fountain.

Aviation enthusiasts can head to the Fleet Air Arm Museum in Yeovilton, which showcases a remarkable collection of aircraft and exhibits related to the Royal Navy's Fleet Air Arm.

Just forty minutes south takes you to the wonderful seaside resort of Lyme Regis with the Jurassic coastline unfurling its secrets. The Jurassic Coast unveils ancient tales in its dramatic cliffs and fossil-rich shores, showcasing 185 million years of Earth's history through stunning geological formations and fossils.
