

Chateau Grandchamp De Chablis

Region: France **Sleeps:** 12

Overview

In the heart of Burgundy, this 18th-century château rises with quiet grandeur, surrounded by three acres of expansive grounds. It's a place where mornings begin with croissants from the local village boulangerie and end with chilled Chablis on the terrace as the sun slips behind ancient trees.

Lovingly restored, the château blends historic character with contemporary comforts across three floors. Inside, grand yet welcoming interiors unfold: think attractive living spaces, original fireplaces and comfortable bedrooms, some en suite, that nod to the estate's heritage. A separate garden house offers extra accommodation and a relaxed games room complete with wood-burning stove.

Outdoors, the rhythm of the day is set by the sun and the scent of cut grass. Start with breakfast on the terrace, then take your pick: rally on the private tennis court, splash in the heated swimming pool, or join a friendly game of boules. Children will love the play area, table tennis and football goals, while adults may retreat to a lounge with a novel or perhaps a glass of something local.

And when the urge to explore strikes, Chablis lies within half an hour by car. This jewel of a town, known globally for its crisp white wines, offers tastings in centuries-old cellars and leisurely lunches in welcoming bistros. Closer to home, the local village is just 3km away and hosts a Saturday morning market, café-bar and boulangerie.

Whether gathering for family holidays, escaping with friends or simply soaking up Burgundy's slow pleasures, this château offers atmosphere, authenticity and the warmth of a historic family home.

Location & Local Information

This beautiful 18th-century château is set within 3 acres of extensive grounds in the open countryside, around half an hour by car from the prestigious wine town of Chablis.

This setting offers an idyllic rural retreat, with a charming local auberge only 1km away. Just a short drive brings you to a nearby village, Seignelay, offering everything you might need: a traditional boulangerie for fresh morning pastries, a Saturday market, a wine shop, a café-bar and a pharmacy.

The town of Chablis (25km) itself is a jewel in the Burgundy wine crown, renowned the world over for its crisp, mineral-rich white wines. Beyond its prestigious vineyards, Chablis offers a delightful blend of elegance and authenticity, with narrow lanes lined with honey-hued stone buildings, wine bars tucked into 12th-century cellars, and weekly markets showcasing artisan cheeses, cured meats, and freshly baked tarts. Spend an afternoon wandering through its charming streets, visiting the historic Obédiencerie (a former monastery now central to the town's winemaking story) and enjoying a glass of chilled Chablis in a leafy courtyard.

Wine tasting is, of course, a major draw here, and the surrounding area is dotted with domaines and family-run estates offering guided tours and generous tastings. The countryside is a patchwork of neatly tended vines, offering scenic drives, gentle walks, and picnic spots with sweeping views. Whether you're a seasoned oenophile or an enthusiastic amateur, this region offers a truly immersive wine experience.

A little further afield, the town of Auxerre is a treasure trove of medieval architecture and riverside charm. Its cobbled streets, half-timbered houses and soaring cathedral make it a delightful spot for sightseeing and shopping. Stop for lunch at one of its riverside bistros or take a stroll along the Yonne River to soak in the town's beauty.

For a change of pace, a day trip to Paris is wonderfully feasible. The local station, only 8km from the château, offers direct trains to the capital, placing the museums, boutiques and boulevards of Paris within easy reach for a spontaneous adventure.
