

Le Mas Paradou

Region: Provence-Alpes **Sleeps:** 4

Overview

Behind the stone façade of this 17th-century Provençal home lies an artist's retreat steeped in soul and authenticity. Set on the edge of a picturesque village, Le Mas Paradou is a house of real character. Here, time slows. Notes of classical music float through sunlit rooms, artefacts whisper of far-flung places and rows of books invite you to linger just a little longer.

At its heart is the double-height Music Room, once a barn, now a striking space alive with creativity and warmth. Armchairs are nestled between an eclectic mix of furnishings alongside a music library and a sound system that fills the space with atmosphere. The farmhouse kitchen, with its rustic fireplace and French doors to the garden, sets the tone for slow Provençal lunches that spill into the afternoon. Elsewhere, a cosy TV lounge and study offer room to think, read or simply be.

Outdoors, the garden unfolds in green symmetry. Manicured cypress trees frame a generous lawn, while fruit trees are scattered across the grass. The private pool, ten metres long and edged with sun loungers, offers cool reprieve on hot summer days, and there is a shaded spot for al-fresco breakfasts or evening meals.

Perfect for couples, creatives or possibly a small family seeking something truly distinctive, the house sleeps 4-5 guests across two charming double bedrooms (one also featuring a children's single bed), each room reached via its individual staircase.

The village of Le Paradou is just a five-minute stroll away, where you'll find a café, bakery and small grocery store alongside a small handful of restaurants including the much-loved Bistrot du Paradou. Just 2km away, Maussane-les-Alpilles offers more dining options and a weekly market, whilst Les Baux-de-Provence, a hilltop village carved into ancient rock, is just 5 km away. The Roman treasures of Arles and the cultural riches of Avignon are both within easy reach.

For those seeking a home of warmth, history and individuality, Le Mas Paradou invites you to experience Provence with authenticity and artistic character.

Location & Local Information

At the foot of Les Alpilles mountains, the charming village of Le Paradou is an enchanting Provençal escape. Surrounded by olive groves and limestone peaks, this picturesque setting offers timeless charm and a warm, village atmosphere.

Le Mas Paradou enjoys a fantastic setting, located on the country road connecting Mourières and Fontvieille that passes through the village. Less than a five-minute stroll from your doorstep, you'll find a café-bar, Spar grocery store and a bakery, the perfect place to begin each day with fresh croissants and bread. The village is also home to a small handful of restaurants including the iconic Bistrot du Paradou (500m on foot).

Just 2km away lies the more vibrant village of Maussane-les-Alpilles, home to an array of excellent restaurants, little shops and other essential amenities. The main square is a lovely spot for a shady lunch on a café terrace whilst the small Thursday morning market is a delight – look out for the region's famous olive oil.

A short drive brings you to the remarkable hilltop village of Les Baux-de-Provence (5km), officially listed among the most beautiful in France. Perched dramatically 250 metres above the landscape, this ancient stronghold offers breathtaking views stretching southwards to Arles and the wild plains of the Camargue. Wander the cobbled lanes, then explore the atmospheric castle ruins and climb the tower for a truly unforgettable panorama.


This location places you at the heart of Les Alpilles Natural Park, where olive groves and pine forests form a painterly backdrop for cycling, hiking and horseback riding. Nearby Saint-Rémy-de-Provence (12km) is a cultural gem, known for its Roman ruins, art galleries and bustling Wednesday morning market. Follow in Van Gogh's footsteps along the scenic art trail that inspired some of his greatest works.

To the south-west, Arles (17km) entices with its extraordinary Roman amphitheatre, charming old town, and vibrant arts scene, while the Camargue promises wild white horses, pink flamingos, and sweeping salt flats.

For a taste of history and grandeur, take a day trip to Avignon (38km) and visit the grand Palais des Papes or the iconic Pont d'Avignon. Alternatively, marvel at Roman engineering at Le Pont du Gard (39km), a UNESCO World Heritage site, only 40 minutes by car.
