

# Le Vieux Presbytere

**Region:** Languedoc   **Sleeps:** 10

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## Overview

Stone walls thick with history, pale blue shutters and the scent of Mediterranean herbs drifting from tiered garden beds - Le Vieux Presbytère welcomes guests into a beautifully restored slice of southern French life. Set in the tiny village of Brézilhac, this former presbytery has been thoughtfully reimagined as a refined yet relaxed retreat, just half an hour from the medieval wonder of Carcassonne.

Inside, the house unfolds over three inviting levels. At its heart is a farmhouse-style kitchen where exposed stone walls meet modern convenience, complete with a central island, deep stone sink and ample room to gather over coffee or wine. The living room offers cosy elegance, with plush seating, a wood-burning stove and an honesty bar. Streaming platforms and Wi-Fi ensure downtime is as entertaining as it is restful.

Five generous bedrooms are spread across the upper floors, all with king-size beds that can be reconfigured as twins, making the property wonderfully flexible for families or groups. Three bathrooms, including one en-suite, provide comfort and privacy. Air-conditioning in four of the bedroom ensures cool respite after sun-soaked days.

Step outside and discover a terraced Mediterranean garden where flowers, lavender and Cypress trees frame the idyllic scene. The private heated pool, 11 by 4 metres with Roman steps, invites refreshing swims, while the dining terrace and shaded lounge areas are ideal for leisurely meals or evening apéritifs.

The village itself is small, authentic and surrounded by rolling countryside, yet not too remote. In summer, Brézilhac comes alive on Thursday evenings with a little night market with a beer and pizza van. Essentials, from boulangeries to bistros, are just 10 minutes away in Montréal and Belvèze, while the larger towns of Castelnaudary, Mirepoix and Limoux are within easy reach, each offering their own culinary and cultural pleasures.

Whether gathering with family or reconnecting with friends, Le Vieux Presbytère blends character, comfort and French charm in one elegantly unhurried setting.

## House Interiors

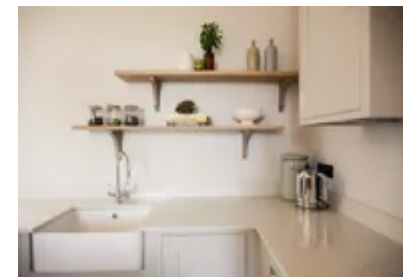
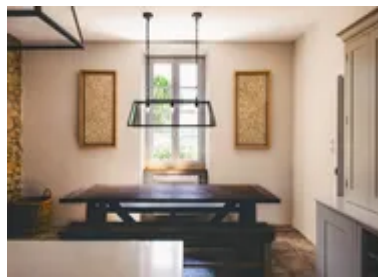
## Outside Grounds

- Sun terrace with loungers and chairs
- Dining terrace with table and benches
- Gas barbecue

- Further covered terrace with seating area
- Terraced grounds with steps and low walls
- Garden with lawn, flowers and Mediterranean plants
- Private gated parking for 2 cars

# Location & Local Information

Set in the rural heart of the Aude department, Le Vieux Presbytère offers an inviting escape in the tiny village of Brézilhac, an ideal base for exploring the region's characterful towns, rich heritage and vineyards. In July and August, Brézilhac comes alive on Thursday evenings with a relaxed village market, complete with pizza and beer vans, perfect for an authentic, convivial night out.

Just 10 minutes by car, Montréal (8km) and Belvèze-du-Razès (6km) offer essential amenities including restaurants, café bars, a grocery store and an electric vehicle charger. Montréal's small Super U is conveniently open on Sunday mornings, ideal for stocking up after you have arrived.

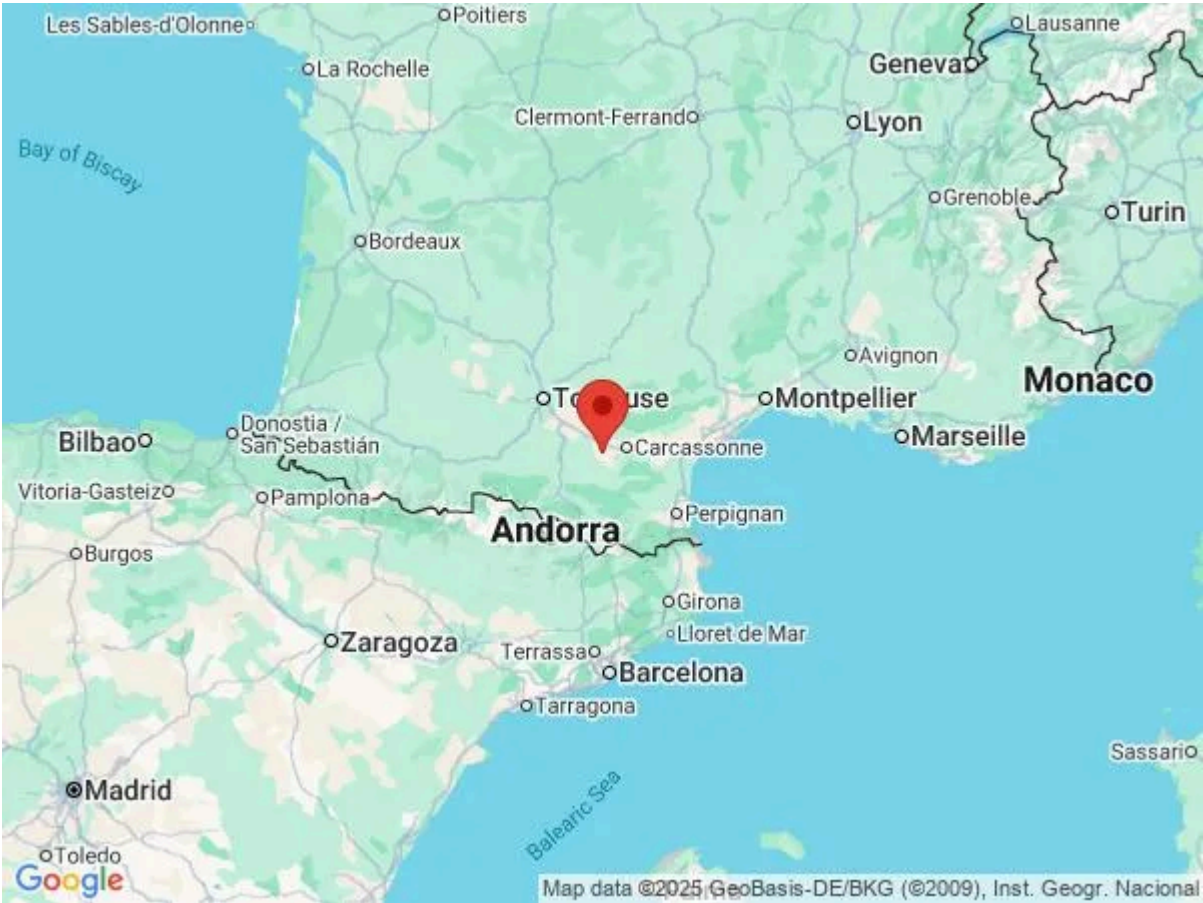
Slightly further afield, Bram (12km) and Castelnaudary (23km) provide larger supermarkets and additional facilities. Castelnaudary, the proud home of the iconic cassoulet, is well worth a visit for food lovers, who can sample this hearty regional speciality in its traditional setting. The nearby Canal du Midi adds further charm, with leisurely towpath walks, cycling routes and boat trips.

Carcassonne (26km) is an unmissable highlight. Its breathtaking medieval Cité, complete with ramparts, towers, lively squares and restaurants, offers a magical day out for both history enthusiasts and families. Throughout the year, the city hosts cultural festivals, concerts and historical reenactments, making every visit feel special.

The delightful market towns of Mirepoix (23km) and Limoux (21km) are equally rewarding excursions, each with their own distinct character. Mirepoix enchants with its timber-framed arcades and colourful Monday morning market, while Limoux is famed for its sparkling wine, Blanquette de Limoux, and a lovely central square perfect for a long lunch.
