

# Chateau Persee

Region: Midi-Pyrenees   Sleeps: 10

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## Overview

Surrounded by the rolling fields of the Aveyron countryside, Château Persée is a storybook escape where heritage and French charm live side by side. Dating back to the 15th century, this majestic estate invites guests to experience life at a gentler pace, wrapped in the elegance of a bygone era. As you arrive, the timeless façade and spacious grounds offer a sense of grandeur, setting the tone for a stay defined by comfort and connection.

Inside, the château's richly layered interiors reveal centuries of character. A grand salon with a crackling fireplace and an intimate sitting room provide spaces for gathering and reflection. The rustic kitchen and dining area invite long, candle-lit meals, where culinary exploits begin on the Lofra Doubleoven and end with stories shared over local wine. For moments of solitude, all five bedrooms offer restful sanctuaries, each uniquely styled with antique flourishes, two with en suite bathrooms.

Step outdoors and the enchantment continues. Days drift by beside the secluded pool or in the soothing embrace of the hot tub, surrounded by expansive gardens. As dusk settles, al fresco dining under the glow of string lights becomes a cherished ritual, whether it's wood-fired pizza with the family or a celebratory feast under the stars.

Located near the village of Montbazens, Château Persée lies in one of southern France's most captivating yet underexplored regions. From the cobbled charm of Belcastel to the medieval mystery of Peyrusse-le-Roc, every day offers a new discovery. Local markets brim with regional flavour, while day trips to Saint-Cirq-Lapopie or Rocamadour unveil some of France's most iconic treasures. Outdoor enthusiasts will find endless adventure across the wider region's rivers, trails and gorges, while culture lovers can uncover the artistic heart of Rodez and beyond.

Ideal for couples, families or groups, the château provides generous space without losing its warmth or historic character – a place where past and present weave together to create something rare.

# Location & Local Information

Located in the Aveyron countryside, Château Persée is a short distance from the village of Montbazens. This undiscovered corner of southern France is rich with traditional character and authentic charm. To the north is the Lot River or venture south to iconic gems such as Najac, Saint-Antonin-Noble-Val and the Gorges de l'Aveyron.

Montbazens (1.5km) itself offers essential conveniences, including a good bakery, a butchers and a simple local restaurant (best visited in the evening). Be sure to experience the village's Wednesday morning market where stalls brim with regional produce. Some guests choose to walk to Montbazens (along country roads, no pavement) or it's a quick drive/cycle ride.

Within a short distance, guests can uncover a tapestry of picturesque villages. The fairytale hamlet of Bournazel (7km) is home to a beautifully restored Renaissance château, while the medieval ruins of Peyrusse-le-Roc (10km) are steeped in mystery and intrigue. One of the region's crown jewels is Belcastel (20km), a riverside village of stone houses and cobbled lanes, famed not only for its breathtaking setting but also for its Michelin-starred dining.

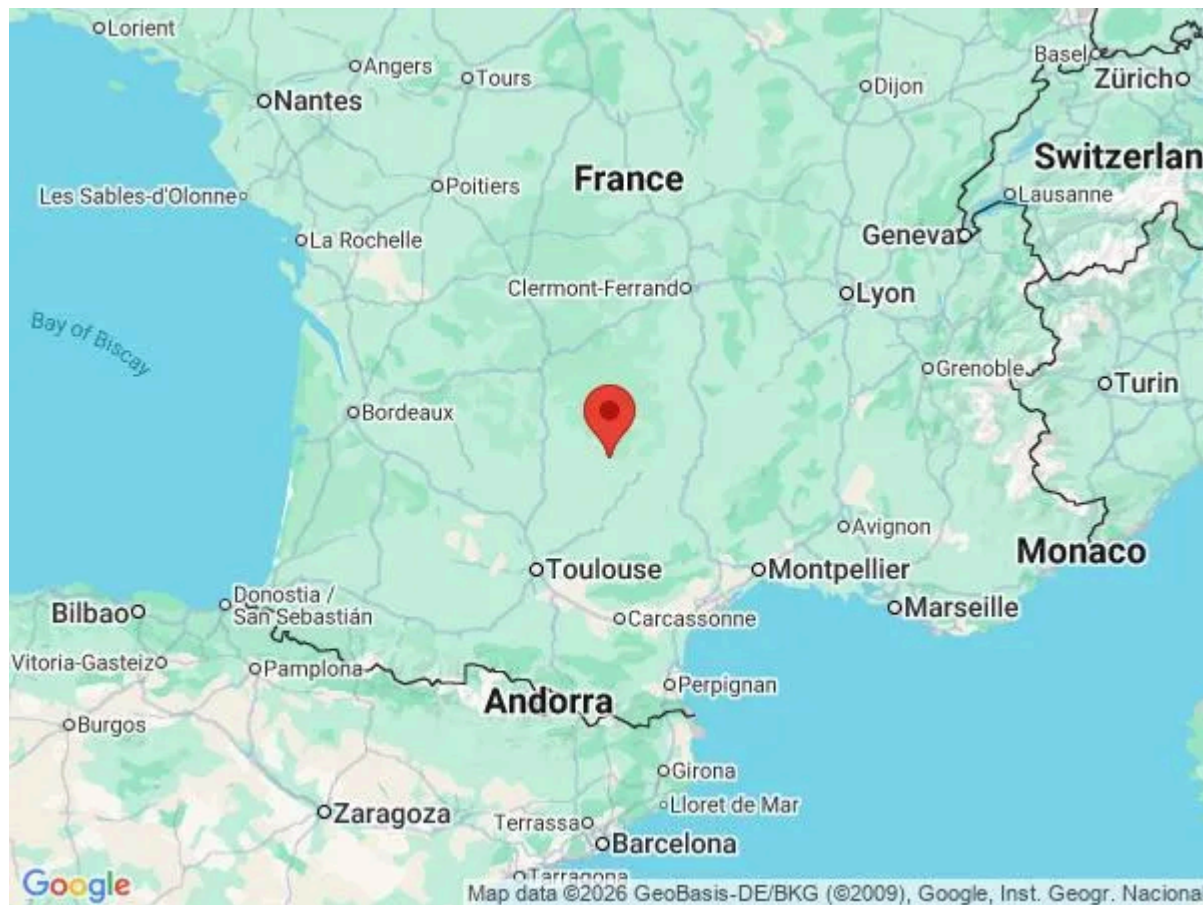
For a deeper dive into local life, venture to the weekly markets of Villefranche-de-Rouergue (28km) or Decazeville (13km), each offering a colourful slice of rural culture. Get there early to soak in the best of the stalls and savour the atmosphere. Rodez (40km), the historic capital of Aveyron, is also within easy reach and offers a vibrant cultural scene, including museums, galleries and the renowned Soulages Museum dedicated to France's celebrated abstract artist.

For adventurous day trips, the dramatic cliffside village of Rocamadour (73km) and the vast underground caverns at Gouffre de Padirac (80km) make for an unforgettable outing. Alternatively, soak in the beauty of Saint-Cirq-Lapopie (60km), one of France's most beloved villages, or explore the medieval streets and outdoor activities around Saint-Antonin-Noble-Val (60km) and the spectacular Gorges de l'Aveyron.

Indeed, this part of France is a paradise for outdoor adventurers who love cycling, hiking, canyoning, rafting, kayaking, wild swimming and so much more. The owner can also advise on the best wine tasting routes across the wider region.
