

Chateau Charles-Henri

Region: Midi-Pyrenees **Sleeps:** 12

Overview

Château Charles-Henri is a place where history and elegance unfold in beautiful surroundings. Set within its private parkland, this gracious château offers far more than a stay. It is an immersion in the French art of living, where architectural heritage and contemporary comfort come together with natural ease. Every arrival feels unhurried, every detail carefully considered, creating an atmosphere of rare refinement and calm.

Within its walls, 800m2 of living spaces and bedrooms reveal majestic proportions and an unmistakable sense of occasion. Grand rooms filled with soft light invite conversation and lingering evenings, while the gentle presence of period details adds depth and character throughout. Six bedroom suites provide a deeply restful retreat, each designed as a private haven with canopied or fourposter beds, fine furnishings and beautifully appointed bathrooms with walk-in showers, some also featuring decadent baths. Modern comforts such as the lift, air-conditioning and the custom-designed kitchen sit effortlessly alongside historic charm, ensuring both indulgence and ease from morning to night.

Life at the château flows naturally between historic interiors and the open air. The landscaped park frames far reaching views across the valley towards the Montagne Noire, offering a constantly shifting backdrop to days spent outdoors. A private heated swimming pool becomes the heart of long summer afternoons, while shaded paths through woodland invite quiet walks where deer and squirrels often pass by. Whether gathering for shared meals, enjoying moments of wellness in the sauna or simply pausing with a book, the rhythm here is unforced and deeply restorative.

The setting is as compelling as the château itself. Positioned at the foot of the Montagne Noire, at the crossroads of the Tarn, Aude and Haute Garonne, Château Charles-Henri sits within a region rich in heritage, landscapes and gastronomy. Nearby Sorèze and Revel offer historic streets and café culture, not to mention Revel's famous Saturday market, while lakes, forests and hilltop villages provide endless opportunities for gentle exploration. From here, day trips to Albi, Toulouse or Carcassonne unfold with ease, making the château an elegant base from which to experience the authentic character of southern France.

Château Interiors (800m2)

Main Floor

- Entrance hall with wide staircase and lift
- Living room with grand piano, large desk and chesterfield sofa/armchairs
- Dining room with table for 12 guests
- Custom-designed kitchen with stone worktop, central island, large gas stove with plancha and double oven, two fridges, freezer, dishwasher, microwave, coffee machines. Doors open to terrace with barbecue
- Utility room with laundry facilities

- 2 x bedrooms with king-size double bed (180cm wide), seating, study/workspace and en suite bathroom with walk-in shower, double basins and toilet

Location & Local Information

Set at the foot of the Montagne Noire, the final outcrop of the Massif Central before the majestic Pyrenees, Château de Charles-Henri enjoys a wonderfully evocative setting within its beautiful parkland. At the crossroads of the Tarn, Aude and Haute Garonne, this region allows you to immerse yourself in a region rich in history, unspoilt landscapes and refined gastronomic traditions. Between charming villages and a deep-rooted art of living, this part of southern France reveals its most authentic character.

Just moments away, the historic Tarn village of Sorèze (2.5km) enchants with its narrow lanes, abbey-school heritage and café-lined squares, perfect for a leisurely wander. A little further on, Revel (8km) is famed for its vibrant Saturday market, widely regarded as one of the finest in France, where colourful stalls brim with local cheeses, charcuterie and seasonal produce beneath the medieval covered hall. Nearby, the Bassin de Saint-Ferréol offers a scenic lakeside escape, ideal for gentle walks, picnics and waterside relaxation.

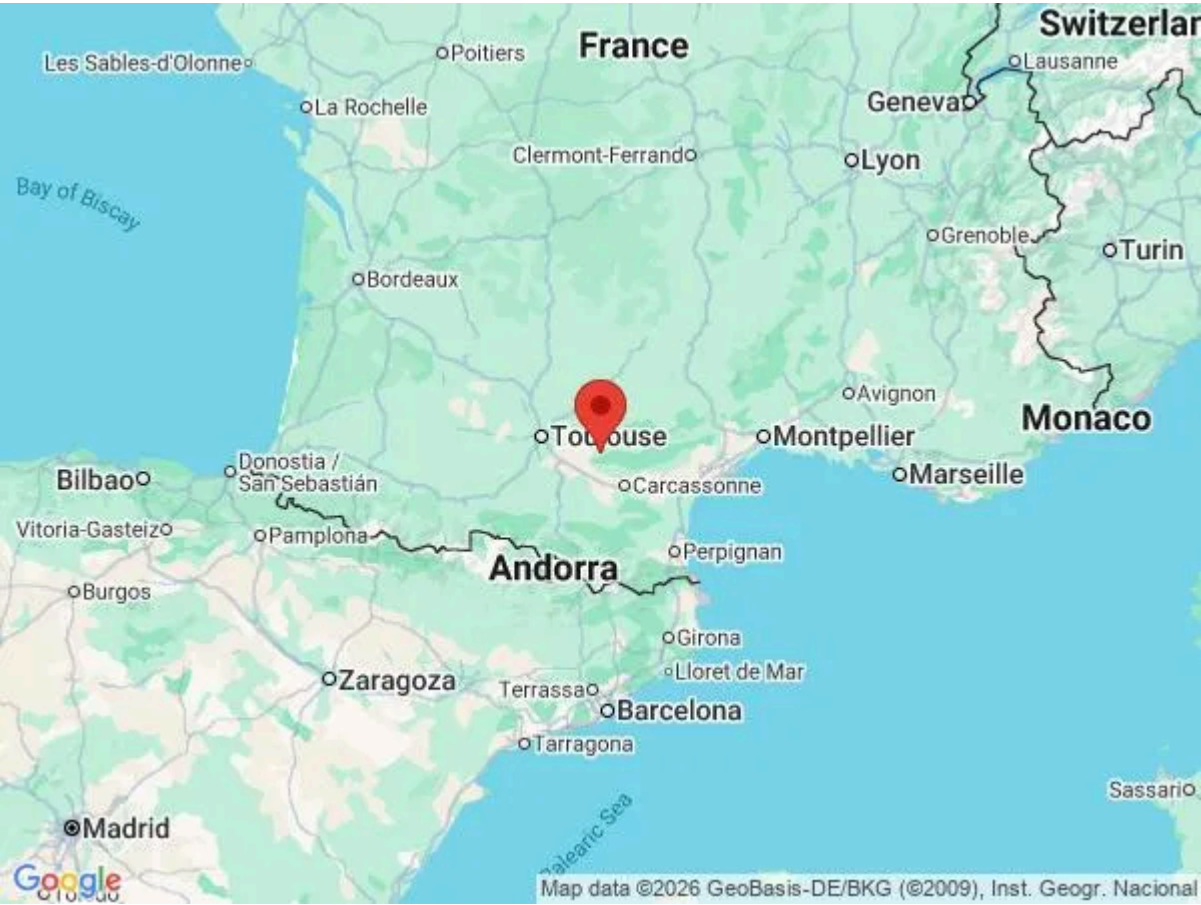
The surrounding Montagne Noire provides a dramatic natural playground, with forested trails, quiet villages and panoramic viewpoints waiting to be explored. Walkers and cyclists will appreciate the varied terrain, while peaceful country roads reveal hidden hamlets and far-reaching views across the plains.

From the château, you are also perfectly placed for day trips deeper into south-west France to visit the Cathar castles, including Saissac Castle (26km), the episcopal city of Albi (64km) and the iconic medieval citadel of Carcassonne (53km).

Food and wine lovers will feel equally at home. Local markets and restaurants celebrate the generous flavours of the region, from cassoulet and duck confit to delicate fruit tarts. The wider region is also excellent for wine-tasting in Gaillac and the Languedoc, where vineyards produce characterful reds, whites and rosés that reflect the diversity of the surrounding landscapes.

- There are two other houses within the vast estate (around 100m away, near the main entrance gate), however they are completely private to the château and its parkland.

Terms & Conditions

- **Security deposit:** €3000 charged to client's credit card by Oliver's Travels as a pre-authorisation at least 2 weeks prior to arrival and refunded two weeks after departure, subject to full inspection
- **Arrival time:** Between 5.00 p.m. and 7.00 p.m.
- **Departure time:** 10.00 a.m.
- **Energy costs included?:** Yes.
- **Linen & towels included?:** Yes, changed once for stays over 7 nights.
- **Pets welcome?:** Yes, on request with owner with an additional charge of €20 per pet per day.
