Overview

Set amid private grounds opening to fields and pockets of woodland, Maison Les Combes offers a sense of space and calm that is increasingly rare. Arriving along a long driveway, the house reveals itself as a warm and characterful retreat, thoughtfully renovated to balance tradition with contemporary comfort. Inside, generous proportions and carefully chosen furnishings create an atmosphere that feels both refined and easy to settle into.

The ground floor is designed for relaxed, sociable living. A brilliantly equipped kitchen with a central island forms the heart of the home, ideal for slow breakfasts or preparing evening meals with fresh market produce. Then there's the open plan dining and living area with wood beams, exposed stone and pillars alongside a sliding door inviting you to the poolside terrace. A utility room with additional shower facilities adds practicality, while upstairs, three superb bedrooms offer restful privacy, as well as a spacious family bathroom.

In a private setting, verdant gardens surround the house and young children will delight in the garden swings. Days can be spent drifting between the shaded dining terrace and the private pool, where loungers line the sun terrace and a poolside shower offers a refreshing pause.

Only 1.5km from the small village of Montesquieu, this location places you within easy reach of local life while preserving a sense of seclusion. Sérignac sur Garonne (6km) provides everyday essentials within minutes by car. Along the River Garonne, the charming town of Port Sainte Marie offers a wider selection of shops and a relaxed waterside atmosphere. For a livelier pace, Agen is within half an hour, known for its bustling markets, excellent restaurants and regional specialities.

Whether gathering around the table, exploring the surrounding countryside or simply enjoying the rhythm of rural France, Maison Les Combes invites you to experience a stay defined by comfort, space and an authentic sense of place.

Location & Local Information

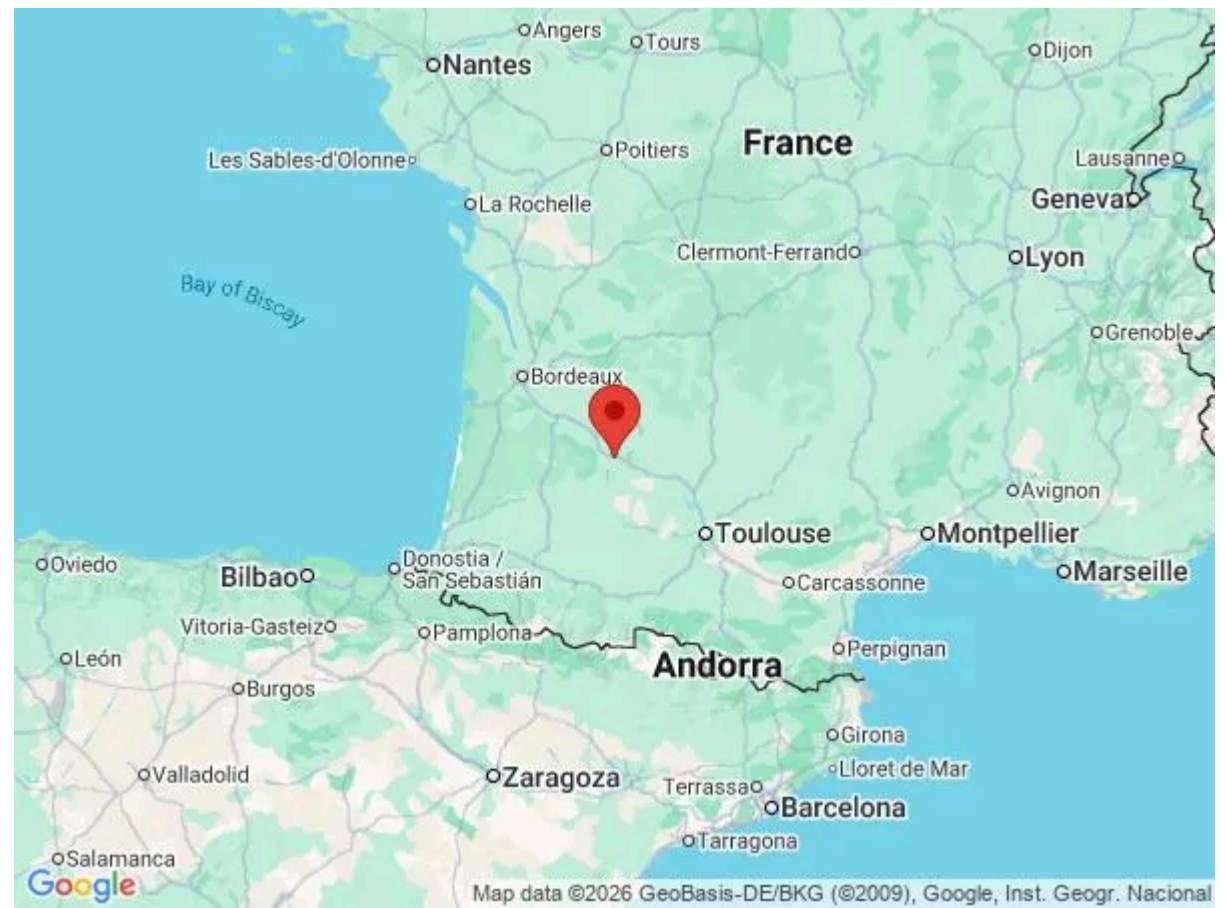
Set within private grounds opening to fields and woodland, Maison Les Combes offers a delightful retreat in the heart of Lot-et-Garonne, just outside the rural village of Montesquieu (1.5km) and within half an hour to the historic town of Agen.

For everyday essentials, the nearby village of Sérignac-sur-Garonne (6km) provides essential amenities, including a grocery store, bakery and pizzeria. A short drive brings you to Port Sainte Marie (11.5km), a picturesque riverside town along the Garonne where you'll find a wider range of shops and services, as well as a train station with connections towards Agen and Bordeaux via Marmande.

The historic town of Agen (18km) offers a lively atmosphere and excellent shopping opportunities, from supermarkets to lovely shops. Its renowned market days are a highlight, with stalls brimming with fresh produce, regional delicacies and the famous Agen prunes. The town's thriving restaurant scene showcases the rich culinary heritage of the region, making it a delightful destination for food lovers.

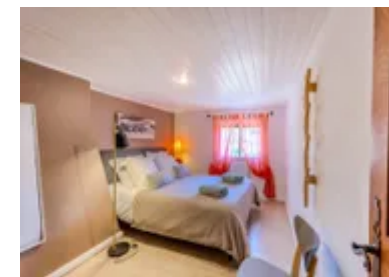
The surrounding countryside invites exploration at a leisurely pace. To the north, the Lot River near Castelmoron-sur-Lot (36km) and Villeneuve-sur-Lot (46km) offers opportunities for water-based activities. Closer to home, the vineyards around Buzet-sur-Baïse (15km) are perfect for wine-tasting, while scenic walking and cycling routes, including stretches of the Canal des 2 Mers à Vélo between Damazan and Agen, wind through the landscape.

To the south, the elegant town of Nérac (16km) reveals a rich heritage, while the neighbouring Gers region is dotted with beautiful villages such as Larressingle, Fourcès and Montréal, all within around 45 minutes by car, each offering their own unique character and timeless appeal.
